on behalf of Lombardy Region, hereby I confirm the interest in supporting the project **I-SharE LIFE “Innovative sharing solutions for full electric travels in small medium size urban areas »**

Over the last decade, the Regional Government of Lombardy has supported many studies and projects on the issue, and amassed the necessary intelligence to identify appropriate areas of action, which include setting specific targets and regional objectives, both to mitigate climate change through the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions and to assure a good quality of air through the decrease of atmospheric pollution.

With regard to mitigation to climate change, the Region has undertaken several actions to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, one of which involves incorporating the realization of this important objective into its repertory of planning and programming policies for energy, air quality, transport and industry in general, as well as into all regional policies that have a bearing on climate change and on the necessary reduction of greenhouse gases.

This commitment has been strenghtened also at an international level: under the «Compact of States and Region», an initiative that provides a transparent global picture of efforts to tackle climate change from 62 state and regional governments, Lombardy Region has pledged itself to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 40% by 2030 with respect to 2005.

Moreover, by entering into the Under2 Coalition together with other 176 sub-national jurisdictions in the world, Lombardy Region further commits itself to reducing greenhouse gas emissions by at least 80% by 2050 with respect to 2005.

As far as air quality is concerned, it is aknowledged that the Po Valley (northern Italy) represents an important non attaining zone for PM, NO2 and O3 thus the enforcement of the air quality limit values. Lombardy Region started implementing an air quality plan over the last decade, however it has been
